- HRM Grade 9 Citizenship Award: a few amazing grade 9 students submitted applications for this award, and this year's recipient is Niall Marshall. All the applicants shared with the committee their many accomplishments and perspectives on good citizenship and it was a privilege to see all the wonderful things they are doing. Niall is a dedicated school and community participant and we are so pleased he will be receiving his award at City Hall in mid-May.
- Catapult Camp an amazing leadership camp at Acadia University every August – once again asked schools to nominate a grade 9 student for this fullyfunded experience. We have sent in our applicant's nomination package and will hear in early May if this student has been selected as one of 50 campers from across the province to attend.
- Dalhousie Law students were at our school the end of March and early April to present to all of our grade 8s and 9s about youth and their rights within the criminal justice system. The presentations were very informative, well delivered, and the students (and teachers) all learned a lot!

- Techsploration team is well underway in their planning for their conference in early May at NSCC Truro Campus. They are working with a terrific role model this year: she is a Tugboat Captain on Halifax Harbour, and the field trip was fantastic fun and so educational.
- Many of our grade 7 and 8 ANS students have been applying for a summer math camp. The camp is a joint effort between the Black Educators' Association and Dalhousie.
- Five of our grade 9 ANS students took part in an Afrocentric Leadership Summit at MSVU last week. They had an amazing day immersed in workshops, presentations, and networking with the community.
- Rhonda and Skyler are about to embark on their final round of "We're Not That Kind of School" workshops to every homeroom. This final session will review all that the students have learned to date, we'll share the results of the data collected from the students over the school year and find out what the students envision as the next step this initiative should take.
- This year, we have had a tremendous level of interest in the O2 (Options & Opportunities) program from our grade 9s. It seems that students and families are realizing what an exciting and unique program this is and all the benefits it offers students. 23 of our Grade 9s are in the process of completing their applications, and in May they will all interview (along with many students from the other jr. highs) for one of the 20 spots in the program, which starts in grade 10 and runs for their 3 years of high school. Rhonda will help prep them for the interviews. We wish them luck.
