Grade 9 English Language Arts

Reading Workshop

These classes consist of activities designed to allow students to further develop their literacy skills as well as time to read independently. Students are provided with some reading material and are expected to gather reading material (fiction and nonfiction) in which they are interested in for these classes. This year students will have access to reading material through weekly visits to our library, Ms. Robar's classroom library, and various online platforms approved by HRCE.

Writing Workshop

These classes consist of activities designed to allow students to further develop their writing skills. All stages of the writing process (including, but not límíted to: brainstormíng, drafting, revising, editing, and polishing) are covered through minilessons and the application of these skílls.

Learning Opportunities

The following will be covered this year, but are not limited to:

- Short stories
- Poetry Non-fiction texts Book clubs
- Podcasts
 - Digital media Oral presentations

Speaking and Listening These classes consist of activities designed to allow students to further develop their speaking and listening skills. Students will be assessed on speeches, and both formal and informal speaking and listening

Assessment

Students will be presented with numerous opportunities to show their understanding of the course outcomes throughout the year. Some of these opportunities will come as Assessment FOR Learning and others through Assessment OF Learning.

ASSESSMENT FOR LEARNING is the day-to-day feedback given to students on their progress with a specific outcome. It intends to prepare students for any evaluations and assessment OF learning to come and inform future teacher instruction.

ASSESSMENT OF LEARNING comes in the form of projects, assignments, assessments, etc. where the level of a student's understanding of specific outcomes taught is assessed. With assessment OF learning, a formal grade is given.

It is important to note that assessment, whether it be OF or FOR learning, will frequently be occurring and that a variety of assessment tools will be used. Some examples of possible assessment tools are observations, exit slips, self-assessments, conferences, oral presentations, writing tasks, reading responses.
